Back in 2005, a seed was beginning to grow. It was an idea of a few people associated with the Saginaw County Community Mental Health Authority (SCCMHA) who were concerned with the quality of life of adults with disabilities. So many adults served by SCCMHA live at or under the poverty level. For those who reside in adult foster care settings, after paying to have their personal care and community living support needs met, their remaining personal income is nearly nothing. At best it may be \$44 per month, which has not been adjusted in many years. And even then, the cost of medications or other necessities that are not covered by insurance may take most or all of those limited discretionary funds. Very little is left for their personal necessities, let alone individual pleasures of life. Going out to lunch. Purchasing a new coat. Going to a movie. Selecting a gift for a family member. These experiences often were simply not available financially to these adults whose disabilities have made it nearly impossible for them to have such choices in their personal lives. Their clothes may be used, not fit well, or not even be of the person's own selection. Personal outings or preferences that many people take for granted were just not an option for these adults. How would you live if you had \$10 a week or less to spend on your life choices? How would you feel? What would be your quality of life? These were the questions that motivated the creation of a new organization to address these unmet needs.

And so, in 2005 First Choice of Saginaw was born. It began as a volunteer program of SCCMHA, and officially became a separate tax-exempt, non-profit organization in 2007. A group of volunteers work every year on their own time to support this little non-profit. All funds raised are used, except for a few supplies as needed, exclusively for the purchase of annual gift cards. Very few charitable organizations can boast such as robust percentage of funds raised going directly to the intended cause recipients. And every year in December, now for 10 years in a row, adults with disabilities living in an Adult Foster Care home who are identified with financial need, receive gift cards to spend on whatever they wish. Even though the card amounts might be considered nominal, they are graciously and deeply appreciated and are used by such adults every year, who now have a choice on how to spend some added personal funds as they so deem desirable. First Choice is still affiliated with SCCMHA, which supports the organization in many in-kind ways during each year.

Since 2005, First Choice of Saginaw has raised **\$223,158.64**, and disseminated these funds through a total of **4,521** gift cards to adults with serious disabilities in Saginaw County. The faces and voices of these card recipients are noted in this publication, along with the supporters and volunteers who have made First Choice of Saginaw what it is today, a unique organization that meets a special but critical need for some of Saginaw's most challenged citizens. You will learn more about the persons' whose lives have been impacted by First Choice of Saginaw in this first decade report. If you are moved by their stories as so many of us have been, please join us in supporting this unique need in any manner in which you are able. Recipients of First Choice of Saginaw are our fellow Saginaw citizens, who may have been given more challenges in life than most, but who have much to contribute to our community and deserve as we all do, a decent quality of life.

Many of the individuals that I worked with at that time had little or no family support and were living in adult foster care homes with paid care givers. While the Adult Foster Care homes always did their best to provide the basic needs for the people they worked with, the individuals would still have needs and wants that couldn't be met with the very little money they had left after paying their rent to the foster care home. We would all work together as a team trying to provide what we could and filling in the gaps sometimes with donated items from churches and local charitable agencies. However, it was usually items that were hand me downs from others and never something new and just theirs. I know how important it is to me when I am able to go to the store and buy myself a new set of towels or sheets and how something so simple can feel so great. I wanted this for the people that I supported as well. Helping people is truly my passion, so naturally when I heard about the initial First Choice project within the agency that in 2007 became a non-profit organization, I wanted to be involved any way I could.

I have been volunteering with First Choice for at least 13 years now and I certainly don't mind giving up my lunch hour every once in a while, to attend a planning meeting or to volunteer in any number of ways for a fundraising event. I am one of many who have scooped ice cream, grilled hot dogs, made candy grams, bagged cookies, collected money, and donated supplies and money to make it all possible. I believe in the vision of First Choice of Saginaw and I am always so excited to read after the yearly gift card giveaway event what people have chosen to use their gift card on and what it meant to them. I will continue to volunteer for as long as I am able and I hope to see many of you readers at future events, maybe scooping ice cream next to me. Every bit of help counts, thanks

<u>First Choice of Saginaw Celebrates 15 Years of Supporting Persons With</u> <u>Disabilities</u>

At the December 2019 First Choice of Saginaw event, gift cards were distributed for the 15th year. At this annual holiday celebratory event, card recipients as well as other residential consumers and home staff members in attendance were asked to comment on the value of the efforts of First Choice of Saginaw over the years. Their comments serve to emphasize the core purpose and intended role of First Choice of Saginaw since the 2005 initiation: provide for residential consumer personal funds and ensure choice of the use of such funds.

Staff and consumers from **Conquest AFC Home** spoke of the event itself, saying "we love it here." "We go shopping, go right after the event to let recipients choose whatever they want. It is great." Items that have been purchased included "coffee, cookies, pop, hats, gloves, music, clothes, and even Christmas gifts for family members." "The event, as well as the cards, also serve to "increase socialization for consumers."

Southport Home representatives also had positive comments, including that the event was "cool", "real nice" and "thoughtful." "If it wasn't for this program, one young lady from the home would have nothing. Since she has no other personal money, she is always excited to go shopping."

At the **Weiss AFC Home**, staff commented "They [home residents] like it and are anxious to go shopping; First Choice helps them pursue their own goals."

"The event and cards helps you get out during the Christmas season" **Williamson Road Home** members stated. "One resident bought her sister a turkey. Another bought turtles to keep as pets." "It makes me believe that there is a Santa Claus." "I am going to buy some needed clothes," remarked one consumer, while another noted, "I am going to buy some socks."

ResCare Premier Clinton Home staff and consumers pointed out that "it means a lot and is a big help on such a limited income." An **Amari's Home** staff member added that "the cards are often used to meet the cost of otherwise unmet personal needs."

"It means so much. Card recipients often buy clothing and CDs" was the observation of **Beacon Harbor Home** staff. "Some of them [home residents] get very little money and the gift cards help to buy what they need." "The annual get together is also very nice, and is also a chance for residents to see others whom they don't get to see much." "People who cannot afford very much are lucky to get these gift cards." At the **Krasinski AFC Home**, card recipients "will go Christmas shopping, and are grateful that First Choice of Saginaw helps out."

Hoornstra AFC Home residents and staff said "Keep it going!" "They [home residents] always get so excited and receiving the gift cards really helps out a lot of people since they have no extra money. They are excited to go shopping and sometimes even buy presents for their family members."

Whitley Adult Foster Care Home attendees felt the location of the event was "a good setting and very nice." One person had been coming to the event for five years, and another for ten years. One consumer planned to "buy blue jeans" and a staff member added "some people have nobody."

A staff member from **Saginaw Valley AFC Home** summarized: "The best part is that everyone is very thankful. At this event we all see people who we used to know and residents often see others with whom they lived from previous home settings and can get reconnected again. Some people have nothing. First Choice of Saginaw is important as it supports the dignity of being able to buy something for yourself."

FIRST CHOICE OF SAGINAW CONTINUES TO NEED YOU !!!

First Choice of Saginaw is a small, non-profit organization affiliated with SCCMHA that raises funds annually to provide holiday gift cards for adults being served by SCCMHA who have limited discretionary funds and reside in licensed residential settings. This is a serious hidden need in Saginaw County for these adults with disabilities who are often impoverished and have not had the opportunity to have even a small amount of discretionary funds to spend as they wish. In FY2019, First Choice again raised funds to provide gift cards to 325 consumers of SCCMHA services. 2020 fundraising is underway now, the 15th year of this program. Gift cards are annually disseminated in December. The First Choice of Saginaw website address is: <u>www.saginawfc.org</u>.

Any interested person can support First Choice fundraising efforts in a variety of ways, whether you have an hour or two to donate your time, can offer some in-kind resources, cash donation or want to get more involved in the annual fundraising efforts. All SCCMHA staff and providers are invited to participate.

VOLUNTER YOUR TIME

The Friends of First Choice Committee sponsors various fundraising efforts. Watch for these notices, and offer your time to help with an event. Even a brief amount of volunteer time is meaningful for the long range success of First Choice. You can also join the planning committee. We always welcome new planning committee members as well as new and ongoing volunteers.

PROVIDE IN-KIND SUPPORT

Are you too busy to volunteer your time? Most fundraising events invite donations of food or items to sell. Watch for these notices and offer a small in-kind donation to support a planned event when you are able. Used books for book sales, or good condition costume jewelry for jewelry sales, and unused greeting cards of any type are just several examples of the periodic events where you can donate items to help the annual campaign. You can donate jewelry and cards year round. From time to time some staff members have donated event tickets that they have and cannot use for First Choice to offer in a silent auction, with all proceeds going to First Choice. We are also always looking for donations of napkins, paper products and plastic silverware for the various events throughout the year. You can also help promote and participate in fundraising events at any time.

OFFER YOUR RESOURCES

Every increment of support helps the organization. For example, did you know that there is a pop can collection in the lower level break rooms at the Hancock and A&W buildings for First Choice? Some staff donate small amounts of money throughout the year, at various events, at various times or through payroll deductions. Donations from individuals and companies are always welcomed year round.
